Genesis 50:20 But as for you, you meant evil against me; but God meant it for good, in order to bring it about as *it is* this day, to save many people alive.

Joseph's Mourns, Reassures Brothers, Joseph's Death

Joseph mourns Jacob's death & buries him in Canaan

Joseph reassures his brothers

Joseph dies at age 110

Joseph passes on promise of God to people (Gen 46:4)

Job

Chapter 1

V1-5

The Destruction of Job's Possessions & Children

Introduction to Job

Job 1:1 There was a man in the land of Uz, whose name *was* Job; and that man was blameless and upright, and one who feared God and shunned evil.

* V5

Job – example of Godly father - prayed for his children daily!

V6-12 Satan comes before God
* V7 Satan comes from roaming the earth
* V8 The Lord offers Job to Satan
* V10 The infamous “hedge of protection”
* V12 God’s full authority & power over Satan
V13-19 Job loses all possessions and children
V20-23 Job’s response

Job 1:21 And he said: “Naked I came from my mother’s womb, And naked shall I return there. The LORD gave, and the LORD has taken away; Blessed be the name of the LORD.”

Job 1:22 In all this Job did not sin nor charge God with wrong.

Chapter 2 Satan Attacks Job’s Health

V1-6 Satan comes before God again!
* V2 See Satan doing the same thing!
* V3 God’s description of Job again!
* V6 God’s full authority and power over Satan again!
V7-8 Satan strikes Job with boils from head to feet

Job 2:9 Then his wife said to him, “Do you still hold fast to your integrity? Curse God and die!”

Job 2:10 But he said to her, “You speak as one of the foolish women speaks. Shall we indeed accept good from God, and shall we not accept adversity?” In all this Job did not sin with his lips.

V11-13 Job’s three friends come & mourn with him

Job 2:13 So they sat down with him on the ground seven days and seven nights, and no one spoke a word to him, for they saw that his grief was very great.

Chapter 3 Job Despises His Life

V1-19 Job despises the day of his birth
* V3,11,16 Wishes he was never born
V20-26 Questions the use for living
* V20-21 Longs to die

Chapter 4 Eliphaz – Round 1

V1-11 Accuses Job of sin
* V7-8 Eliphaz wrongful conclusion/insinuation
V12-21 Eliphaz hears & sees “something”
* V12, 15-17 A “secret word brought to me” & “a spirit”

Chapter 5 Eliphaz Continues (Some Bibles attributes to God)

V1-16 Eliphaz taunts Job
Job 5:8 “But as for me, I would seek God, And to God I would commit my cause—
V17-27 Eliphaz tells Job to allow God to chasten him and then God will bless him

Job 5:17 “Behold, happy is the man whom God corrects; Therefore do not despise the chastening of the Almighty.

Chapter 6 Job Responds

V1-7 Job wishes Eliphaz could/would understand his situation
V8-10 Job wishes God would just crush him
V11-13 Job states he can’t take much more
V14-23 Job asks for understanding

Job 6:14 “To him who is afflicted, kindness should be shown by his friend, Even though he forsakes the fear of the Almighty.

V24-30 Job is open for corrections
Job 6:24 “Teach me, and I will hold my tongue; Cause me to understand wherein I have erred.

Chapter 7

Job Continues

V1-10 Job shares how hard life has been
* **V3** Been going through this for months!
V11-16 Job speaks of bitterness, being scared/terrified, hating his own life
V17-21 Job asks God questions
Job 7:20 Have I sinned? What have I done to You, O watcher of men? Why have You set me as Your target, So that I am a burden to myself?

Chapter 8

Bildad – Round 1

V1-18 Bildad concludes God is just, therefore if bad things happening Job deserves them
* **V5-7** Prosperity Doctrine
V19-22 Bildad states the way of God is joy, bad things will happen to those who hate you
* **V19-22** Someone tell Jesus, the apostles and all those tortured, maimed, martyred

Chapter 9

Job Responds with Questions of Righteousness

Job 9:2 “Truly I know *it is* so, But how can a man be righteous before God?
Job 9:12 If He takes away, who can hinder Him? Who can say to Him, ‘What are You doing?’
Job 9:15 For though I were righteous, I could not answer Him; I would beg mercy of my Judge.
Job 9:20 Though I were righteous, my own mouth would condemn me; Though I *were* blameless, it would prove me perverse.
Job 9:32 “For He is not a man, as I am, That I may answer Him, *And that* we should go to court together.
Job 9:33 Nor is there any mediator between us, Who may lay his hand on us both.

Chapter 10

Job Continues

V1-22 Job asks God lots of questions!
Job 10:3 *Does it* seem good to You that You should oppress, That You should despise the work of Your hands, And smile on the counsel of the wicked?
Job 10:8-9 ‘Your hands have made me and fashioned me, An intricate unity; Yet You would destroy me. Remember, I pray, that You have made me like clay. And will You turn me into dust again?
Job 10:18 ‘Why then have You brought me out of the womb? Oh, that I had perished and no eye had seen me!

Chapter 11

Zophar – Round 1

V1-20 Zophar accuses Job of hypocrisy – Acting righteous, yet wicked & having iniquity
* **V4-6** You say you are pure, but if God would speak He would tell the “truth”
* **V13-15** If you would repent, He would forgive you and all these good things would happen

Chapter 12

Job Answers

***V1-3** Rebukes his friends with sarcasm
V4-12 I still don’t understand why these things are happening to me, “yet robbers prosper”
V13-25 God holds wisdom
Job 12:13 “With Him *are* wisdom and strength, He has counsel and understanding.

Chapter 13

Job Continues

V1-19 Responds to all their conclusions/accusations
Job 13:1 “Behold, my eye has seen all this, My ear has heard and understood it.

Job 13:4-5 But you forgers of lies, You are all worthless physicians. Oh, that you would be silent, And it would be your wisdom!

Job 13:15-16 Though He slay me, yet will I trust Him. Even so, I will defend my own ways before Him. He also shall be my salvation, For a hypocrite could not come before Him.

V20-27 Job Humbles Himself in Prayer

Job 13:20-21 “Only two *things* do not do to me, Then I will not hide myself from You: Withdraw Your hand far from me, And let not the dread of You make me afraid.

Chapter 14 Job Continues Humbling Himself in Prayer

Job 14:15 You shall call, and I will answer You; You shall desire the work of Your hands.

Chapter 15 Eliphaz - Round 2

* V4-6 Accuses Job of iniquity and hypocrisy

* V1-16 Are you the only wise one?

* V17-35 Eliphaz gives Job his wisdom

Job 15:17 “I will tell you, hear me; What I have seen I will declare,

Chapter 16 Job Rebukes His “Friends”

*V1-5 You are miserable comforters - I would strengthen & comfort you

V6-22 Job describes his miserable life

Chapter 17 Job Continues

Job 17:1-2 “My spirit is broken, My days are extinguished, The grave *is ready* for me. *Are* not mockers with me? And does not my eye dwell on their provocation?”

Job 17:6 “But He has made me a byword of the people, And I have become one in whose face men spit.

Chapter 18 Bildad – Round 2

Job 18:5 “The light of the wicked indeed goes out, And the flame of his fire does not shine.

Job 18:21 Surely such *are* the dwellings of the wicked, And this *is* the place *of him who* does not know God.”

Chapter 19 Job Responds

Job 19:3 These ten times you have reproached me; You are not ashamed *that* you have wronged me.

Job 19:4 And if indeed I have erred, My error remains with me.

Job 19:21 “Have pity on me, have pity on me, O you my friends, For the hand of God has struck me!

Job 19:23-24 “Oh, that my words were written! Oh, that they were inscribed in a book! That they were engraved on a rock With an iron pen and lead, forever!

Job 19:25 For I know *that* my Redeemer lives, And He shall stand at last on the earth;

Job 19:29 Be afraid of the sword for yourselves; For wrath *brings* the punishment of the sword, That you may know *there is* a judgment.”
